Susquehanna River The Susquehanna River () is the second longest river in the U.S. state of Pennsylvania and the 11th longest river in the United States. It is long and has a drainage area of . The Susquehanna River's drainage basin is larger in area than the combined drainage areas of the Danube and Rhine rivers, and the Susquehanna is the largest river in Pennsylvania by discharge at per second. It is the largest tributary of the Chesapeake Bay. The Susquehanna flows from a source near Mount Oliver on the Eastern ridge of the Appalachian Mountains, through the northern half of the state of Pennsylvania to the Susquehanna River Valley, which lies about from the mouth. The river flows through the Susquehanna State Forest and the town of Nescopeck in Luzerne County. Its headwaters are fed by streams from eastern North Carolina, Alabama, and Georgia through the Blue Ridge Mountains. The river flows past Binghamton, Scranton, and points below that in the Susquehanna River Valley, before flowing into the Potomac River in Maryland, past Washington, D.C. The main tributaries of the Susquehanna include the Neshaminy Creek and the Lackawanna River. The name of the river comes from the Lenape language, "Susque-hahanna" meaning 'great river'. Geography and hydrology The Susquehanna River can be characterized by an order of magnitude change in streamflow from year to year due to snowmelt and rainfall, but flows roughly at a rate of per second, or at an average rate of per second. The Susquehanna drains a watershed area of in the northeastern United States (discharge calculated in the watershed divide, the primary source of streamflow data). Per the Geographic Names Information System (GNIS), the river's headwaters are at an elevation of and it flows through the town of Nescopeck on the state line with Pennsylvania. The average
